12–15 Months Before Intake

Research Universities & Courses

- **Shortlist 8–12 universities.**
- **Compare:**
 - Public vs Private Universities
 - Tuition Fees
 - Eligibility Requirements
 - Course Curriculum
 - Language Requirements
 - City & Living Costs

Check Eligibility

Ensure you meet:

- Academic requirements
- Minimum CGPA/Percentage
- Required subjects
- English/German language requirements



10–12 Months Before Intake

Prepare for English Language Tests

Take one of the accepted exams:

- IELTS
- TOEFL
- PTE

Aim for:

- IELTS 6.5–7.5
- Higher scores improve admission opportunities.

Prepare Other Required Exams (If Applicable)

Some programs may require:

- GRE
- GMAT
- TestAS



9–10 Months Before Intake

Gather Required Documents

Prepare:

- Academic transcripts
- Degree certificates
- Passport
- Updated CV/Resume
- Statement of Purpose (SOP)
- Letters of Recommendation (LOR)
- English language test score
- Keep both digital and printed copies.



8–9 Months Before Intake

Apply to Universities

Submit applications through:

- University portals
- Uni-Assist (where applicable)

Apply to multiple universities to improve your chances.

Double-check:

- Deadlines
- Document uploads
- Application fees



5–7 Months Before Intake

Receive Admission Decisions

Possible outcomes:

- Offer Letter
- Conditional Offer
- Waiting List
- Rejection

Compare offers carefully before accepting.



4–5 Months Before Intake

Arrange Finances

Prepare:

- Blocked Account (if required)
- Sponsorship documents
- Education loan (if applicable)
- Scholarship documents

Estimate living expenses before departure.



3–4 Months Before Intake

Apply for Student Visa

Prepare:

- Passport
- Admission Letter
- APS Certificate (for eligible countries)
- Blocked Account proof
- Health Insurance
- Visa application form
- Biometric documents

Book your visa appointment early.



2–3 Months Before Intake

Arrange Accommodation

Options include:

- Student Dormitories
- Shared Apartments (WG)
- Private Apartments

Accommodation fills quickly, especially in major cities.



1–2 Months Before Intake

Prepare for Departure

Book:

- Flight tickets
- Airport transfer (if needed)

Pack:

- Important documents
- Medicines
- Weather-appropriate clothing
- Electronics and adapters

After Arrival in Germany

Complete these important formalities:

- Register your address (Anmeldung)
- Open a German bank account (if required)
- Obtain your residence permit
- Activate health insurance
- Attend university orientation
- Collect your student ID

After Admission

- Accept offer
- Arrange finances

- **Start your preparation 12–15 months before your intended intake.**
- **Apply to multiple universities instead of relying on just one.**
- **Keep scanned copies of every important document in cloud storage.**
- **Apply for accommodation as soon as you receive your admission offer.**
- **Book your visa appointment early, as appointment slots can fill up quickly.**
